PP children's confidence in carrying out presentations has increased with more children wanting to participate in the process. Careers opportunity area funded project for Y5 & 6 has been well received with PP children being exposed to a variety of career options for their future lives. Compass for Life across the academy has allowed children to reflect on their futures and what they aspire to be when they are older. Children set themselves ambitious targets and can talk confidently to others in their class about their choices. Guitar lessons financially supported via PP funding to KS2 PP children. PP children have been role models in the academy with allocated duties which has also included presentations to parents. Trips and visits PP children included in all educational visits so that they are included in the additional learning experiences.
